KENYA: Gitobu Imanyara, journalist, lawyer, human rights activist

On Friday 19 April 1991, Gitobu Imanyara, editor of The Nairobi Law Monthly, currently held in Kamiti prison awaiting trial on sedition charges, collapsed in a cell at the Nairobi Law Courts, where he was awaiting a ruling on his application for bail. He was not admitted to hospital but was taken back to prison where he is reportedly held in a cell with no bed, mattress or other furniture.

The medical officer at Kamiti prison in Nairobi, where Gitobu Imanyara is held, is reported to have said that Imanyara suffers from severe migraine headaches and has collapsed five times since his arrest as a result of his headaches, and risks developing epilepsy if the attacks continue.

Gitobu Imanyara was arrested on 1 March 1991 and charged with publishing a seditious publication, namely $\underline{\text{The Nairobi Law Monthly}}$. He was also charged with publishing the magazine without proper government clearance. Amnesty International has appealed for his immediate and unconditional release as a prisoner of conscience.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

- expressing concern at reports that Gitobu Imanyara has collapsed in court due to serious ill-health;
- appealing for him to be admitted to hospital for urgent medical treatment;
- renewing appeals for his release as a prisoner of conscience.
