UA 144/95 Fear for safety / Extrajudicial execution 20 June 1995

COLOMBIA Javier Alberto BARRIGA VERGEL, human rights lawyer

There are renewed fears for the safety of human rights defenders in Cúcuta city, Norte de Santander Department, after the killing of lawyer Javier Alberto Barriga Vergel.

At 8.30am on 16 June 1995 Javier Alberto Barriga left his house by car in the Los Barrios area of Cúcuta. He was shot dead with two bullets to the head by two unidentified armed men.

Javier Alberto Barriga was a member of the Corporación Colectivo de Abogados José Alvear Restrepo (CCA), José Alvear Restrepo Lawyers' Collective, working for the Comité de Solidaridad con los Presos Políticos (CSPP), Committee of Solidarity with Political Prisoners, in Cúcuta. The CSPP is working on numerous important cases of human rights violations in which members of the police and army are implicated, and its lawyers have repeatedly been subjected to death threats, harassment and physical attack because of their work. The killing of Javier Alberto Barriga has heightened fears that others involved with the CCA and the CSPP may be similarly targeted.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Human rights lawyers and members of human rights organizations are increasingly at risk in Colombia, despite presidential promises to ensure their safety. On 9 September 1994, President Ernesto Samper Pizano declared in a speech that his government "would seek to have constructive relations with human rights organizations with the aim of suppressing human rights violations and would do everything necessary to protect the lives and the integrity of their members" ("Buscará sostener con los organismos de derechos humanos relaciones constructivas en procura de suprimir las violaciones de tales derechos y pondrá de su parte cuanto sea necesario para proteger la vida y la integridad de sus miembros").

Indeed, President Samper has repeatedly pledged his government's commitment to protect human rights and tackle impunity. However, members of the Colombian armed and security forces, together with their paramilitary allies, continue to commit serious violations with virtual impunity. Trade unionists, popular leaders, civic activists and human rights workers are amongst those frequently targeted. Only in exceptional circumstances are perpetrators brought to justice; the vast majority of members of the armed forces responsible for gross human rights violations remain in active service.

# RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters either in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the killing of human rights lawyer Javier Alberto Barriga Vergel on 16 June 1995 in circumstances suggesting that he was extrajudicially executed;
- calling for an immediate and thorough investigation into the killing, the results of which should be made public and those responsible brought to justice; urging that, in line with President Samper's declared commitment to protect the lives of human rights defenders, all possible measures be taken to protect those working with the *Comité de Solidaridad con los Presos Políticos* in Norte Santander region;

- urging the authorities to take immediate measures to dismantle paramilitary groups in line with stated governmental commitments.
