Elizabeth Cañas Cano, a member of the Barrancabermeja branch of ASFADDES, where Rocío Campo works, has been shot dead. Like Rocío Campo, she had lost relatives in the 1998 Barrancabermeja massacre. Witnesses to the massacre and other ASFADDES members are now in grave danger.

Elizabeth Cañas Cano was shot dead near her office on 11 June 2000. A few days earlier she had been followed by two armed men. She had been campaigning through the Asociación de Familiares de Desaparecidos-Detenidos, (ASFADDES), Association of Families of the Detained-Disappeared, to get justice for her son, Giovanni Cañas Cano and her brother, José Milton Cañas Cano, who both "disappeared" during the 16 May 1998 massacre in Barrancabermeja. Rocío Campo's brother, Daniel Campo Pérez, also "disappeared" in the massacre.

To date, although investigations into the massacre have led to the dismissal of three members of the armed forces and disciplinary action against another nine, nobody has been brought to justice.

The whereabouts of the 25 people who "disappeared" remain unknown.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or in your own language:

with the results made public and those responsible brought to justice;

- calling for a full investigation into the killing of Elizabeth Cañas Cano,
- expressing concern for the safety of Rocío Campos and other members of ASFADDES in Barrancabermeja, and calling for action to protect them so they can continue their work of promoting and protecting human rights;
- expressing concern for the safety of witnesses to the May 1998 massacre in Barrancabermeja;
- urging the Colombian government to adhere to its obligations regarding human rights defenders, as laid out in the UN Declaration on the Right and Responsibility of Individuals, Groups and Organs of Society to Promote and Protect Universally Recognized Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms, adopted on 9 December 1998, and the Organization of American States resolution on Human Rights Defenders in the Americas, adopted on 7 June 1999 [AG/RES. 1671 (XXIX-0/99)];
- calling for a full and impartial investigation into links between the security forces and paramilitary groups operating in Barrancabermeja and the surrounding area, urging that the results be made public and those found to be active in or supporting such groups brought to justice;
- urging the authorities to take immediate action to dismantle paramilitary groups, in line with stated government commitments and UN recommendations.
