## USA/UK/IRAQ

In Baghdad 30 people were reportedly killed and at least 100 injured in last night's air strike by United States and United Kingdom forces.

Two girls, aged 21 months and four years, were reportedly killed when missiles hit the Karrada and Hai al-'Adl residential districts of Baghdad. At least 20 houses are also thought to have been destroyed. It is not known if there were any casualties outside the capital.

US officials say more attacks are imminent, posing a high risk of further civilian casualties. One missile apparently landed in the city of Khoramshar in Iran; although no casualties were reported, this does illustrate the high risk of accidental civilian fatalities.

The attack, code-named "Operation Desert Fox", was launched at 22.00 hours GMT on 16 December 1998 and reportedly lasted six hours.
