Further serious incidents involving threats to the safety of Sergio Salvador and Alcira Benítez have recently occurred.

Late in the evening on 13 July 1998 shots were fired into the home of Alcira Benítez from a large white car which drove past at high speed. Alcira Benítez was standing on her doorstep at the time to greet her daughter as she arrived home. There were no injuries and the relevant authorities were informed.

On 27 July Sergio Salvador was approached by two strangers as he left the offices of the *Red de Apoyo por la Justicia y la Paz*, Support Network for Justice and Peace where he is a volunteer. He was warned by them to "que dejaran lo de *la exhumación* [del cuerpo de Nilson Benítez] *porque si no tu serás el próximo exhumado"*, "leave the exhumation [of Nilson Benítez's body] alone or else you will be next". He also noticed that a third person, sitting nearby in a car, was pointing a gun at him. Again the relevant authorities were informed.

The harassment and threats to Sergio Salvador and Alcira Benítez follow their involvement in the investigation into the reported extrajudicial executions of Nilson Enrique Benítez, José Lino Pirela and Omar Montiel by the *Policía Técnica Judicial (PTJ)* Criminal Investigations Police, on 5 June. Those who have been targeted so far include relatives of the victims, eye witnesses to the killings and volunteer members of the human rights organization *Red de Apoyo por la Justicia y la Paz*.

Amnesty International is not aware of further threats to those also named above but continues to be concerned for their safety.

Please continue appeals as specified in original UA taking into account the above information. Appeals by telegrams/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing serious concern at the continued death threats and harassment targeted at Sergio Salvador and Alcira Benítez and calling for guarantees for their safety;

- calling for guarantees for the safety of the others named above;

- urging the government to carry out an immediate investigation into the death threats and harassment of those involved in the case and for those responsible to be brought to justice;

- calling for a full and impartial investigation into the killings of the three men to be carried out without delay and for those responsible to be brought to justice.
