Dear Prime Minister,

The women pictured, and many other women just like them, who were drafted into military sexual slavery are still waiting for justice more than 60 years after the end of World War II.

In 2007, the USA, the Netherlands, Canada and the 27 member states of the European Union passed resolutions urging immediate action on this issue. The resolutions call on the Government of Japan to restore the dignity of these women by providing a public, unambiguous and formal apology for the crimes committed against them.

I urge the Government of Japan to respond to this global call for justice by:

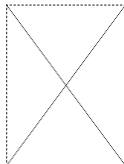
- Accepting full responsibility for the “comfort women system” in a way that acknowledges the harm suffered by these women and providing a full apology.
- Providing adequate financial compensation and rehabilitation to these women, including accurate accounts of the sexual slavery system in Japanese educational text books.
