Title: Rwanda and Burundi: The return home: rumours and realities

Abstract: In July 1994 around 2 million Rwandese refugees fled their country. Around 200,000 refugees from Burundi are also still living outside their country while a further 200,000 are displaced within the country. This report details the risks facing refugees on their return to Rwanda and Burundi and considers the question of repatriation, examining the roles of the governments of Rwanda and Burundi, the governments of countries of asylum, leaders of the refugees and components of the international community. A series of recommendations are made for action needed to create conditions in Rwanda and Burundi which would enable refugees to return voluntarily and safely.

Abstract:Human rights violations continue to be directed against many sectors of society in
Guatemala. Of particular concern is the level of threats against human rights
defenders. The perpetrators of these violations are mainly the police, military and
army-created civil patrols. Little progress has been made to bring to justice those
responsible for past abuses. Exhumations took place in 1995 where large-scale
extrajudicial executions had been reported. No investigations have taken place
to determine how victims died or who was responsible. Instead family members
and others have themselves been harassed.
