Amnesty International fears for the safety of 15-year-old Halil Can Do\_an, detained on 12 July 1996, and of others detained around the same time in a police operation in Ankara which ran from 8 to 16 July. Reportedly the prosecutor at Ankara State Security Court has authorized that Halil Can Do\_an may be held in incommunicado detention at Ankara Police Headquarters until 25 July when he will be brought before a judge to be charged or released. It is not known whether the other detainees are to be taken to court on the same date.

One of those detained, Pervin Abdalo\_lu, is reported to have been released on 18 July and was taken to hospital for examination. It is alleged that she was tortured, including by electric shocks.

Halil Can Do\_an was detained twice during 1995, in March and April, after which he alleged that he had been tortured and ill-treated. On the second occasion his allegations were supported by a medical report.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

People suspected of offences under the Anti-Terror Law can be held in police custody without access to family, friends or legal counsel for up to 30 days in the 10 provinces under State of Emergency in the east and southeast such as Diyarbak\_r, and for 15 days in the rest of Turkey. When not being interrogated, detainees are often held in cramped, airless and insanitary conditions. With no access to the outside world they are at the mercy of their interrogators. Torture is often applied to extract confessions, to elicit information about illegal organizations, to intimidate detainees into becoming police informers or as informal punishment for assumed support of illegal organizations.

Torture methods include being stripped naked and blindfolded, hosing with pressurized ice-cold water, hanging by the arms or wrists bound behind the victim's back, electric shocks, beating the soles of the feet, death threats and sexual assault.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or your own language:**

- expressing concern for the safety of Halil Dan Do\_an, aged 15, and the 17 other people detained on or around 12 July in Ankara and held incommunicado at Ankara Police Headquarters;
- expressing concern also about the reported torture of Pervin Abdalo\_lu;
- urging that the detainees are not subjected to torture or any other form of ill-treatment;
- requesting to be informed of any charges brought against them.
