Further Information on UA 88/03 (MDE 13/009/2003, 31 March 2003, and follow-up, MDE 13/009/2004, 13 February 2004) fear of torture/ill treatment/Prisoner of conscience

IRAN Amir Abbas Fakhravar (m), freelance journalist, aged 26

Amir Abbas Fakhravar was released on leave on or around 21 March, as part of a larger temporary release of prisoners on the occasion of Iran's *No Rouz*, or new year holiday. He has reportedly been granted 19 days' leave.

He had been held at a detention centre referred to as Band 325 (incorrectly called 125 in the last update), which is under the supervision of Iran's Revolutionary Guard, a national security, military and intelligence force. He was reportedly taken there in January and given two days' leave on or around 8 February 2004. On his return he was moved to Qasr prison.

In Qasr Prison he is reportedly held with prisoners convicted of violent crimes, and he has previously been assaulted by other prisoners, possibly because of his status as a political prisoner.

While in Band 325, he reportedly underwent treatment amounting to torture: he was kept in solitary confinement, in conditions of near-silence where he was only able to see the colour white. This "white torture" (*shekanjeh-e sefid*) is a method of extreme sensory deprivation apparently designed to weaken the prisoner by causing persistent and unjustified suffering.

Amir Abbas Fakhravar was sentenced to eight years' imprisonment on defamation charges in November 2002, because of comments on Iran's political leadership in his book *Inja Chah Nist* (This Place is Not a Ditch). In February 2003, he and imprisoned student demonstrator Ahmad Batebi signed an open letter which criticised the Iranian authorities. The letter stated, "We wish to openly and overtly express our dedication to all universal covenants. We want to show our respect for the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, universal peace, non-violence, environmental protection, permanent progress" and added that "violence has absolutely no place in our struggle, neither in our words nor in our deeds." Shortly afterwards, he was reportedly beaten in front of judges in the court room where his appeal was being heard.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send appeals to arrive as quickly as possible, in English, French, Persian or your own language:

- urging the authorities to extend the temporary release of Amir Abbas Fakhravar to permit a full review of the legal process by which he was convicted, with a view to fully acquitting him;
- reminding the authorities that in January 2000, the UN Special Rapporteur on the promotion and protection of the right to freedom of opinion and expression stated that "In the case of offences such as "libelling", "insulting" or "defaming" the head of State and publishing or broadcasting "false" or "alarmist" information, prison terms are both reprehensible and out of proportion to the harm suffered by the victim... imprisonment as punishment for the peaceful expression of an opinion constitutes a serious violation of human rights." (E/CN.4/2000/63, para 205);
- urging the authorities that if Amir Abbas Fakhravar is to be returned to Qasr Prison, he should be kept in conditions commensurate to his category, in line with the UN Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners, which states under Principle 8 that "The different categories of prisoners shall be kept in separate institutions or parts of institutions taking account of their sex, age, criminal record, the legal reason for their detention and the necessities of their treatment".
