## ISRAEL AND THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES: AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL STRONGLY CONDEMNS KILLING OF ISRAELI HOSTAGE, CALLS ON ISRAEL TO STOP DEPORTATION OF PALESTINIAN DETAINEES

Amnesty International has strongly condemned the killing of Sergeant Nissim Toledano, a member of the Israeli Border Police who was taken hostage on 13 December 1992 by the Islamic Resistance Movement (Hamas) and whose body was found two days later. The organization had called on Hamas not to ill-treat or execute him and to release him as he was held as a hostage. It regrets that its appeal has failed.

Amnesty International is appealing to the Israeli authorities not to retaliate to the killing of Sergeant Toledano by deporting hundreds of Palestinians. Over 400 Palestinians, said by the government to be supporters of Hamas and other Palestinian groups, were moved during the night of 16 December to near the border with Lebanon and are now reported to be held blindfold in buses awaiting deportation. The Israeli High Court of Justice has ordered the government not to carry out the deportations until it reviews the decision. It is currently meeting to do so.

Amnesty International opposes the detention and forcible exile of individuals when such measures are imposed solely on account of their political or other beliefs, expressed without using of advocating violence.

# ISRAEL AND THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES: AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL CALLS ON ISRAEL TO ALLOW PALESTINIAN DEPORTEES TO RETURN

Amnesty International condemns the deportation of about 400 Palestinians to Lebanon. The deportees are currently in the Israel-declared "security zone" in South Lebanon. The Lebanese authorities have stated that they will not accept them into Lebanon.

Amnesty International is calling on the Israeli authorities to allow the deportees back into Israel. "If any of them are suspected of an offence, they should be charged and given a prompt and fair trial or released," said the organization.
