RWANDA: FRENCH GOVERNMENT CALLED TO ACCOUNT FOR LINKS BETWEEN FRENCH ARMY AND RWANDESE DEATH SQUADS

Amnesty International is calling on the French Government to investigate and make public any information about the existence and activities of a French military unit that trained some of those responsible for recent mass killing in Rwanda.

The human rights organization's appeal comes in the light of recent allegations by a Rwandese national that French military units were involved in the training of a militia which was the pre-cursor to the infamous *Interahamwe* death squads. He and others had spoken out long before the current mass killing in Rwanda about the existence of government-organized death squads, but only this week claimed a French army unit trained them.

The French military unit in question is known as the *Détachement d'Assistance Militaire d'Instruction* (DAMI), Military Instruction and Assistance Unit, which was allegedly in operation in Rwanda until December 1993. Details of the French military assistance aureement signed with Rwanda in 1975. Including information about DAMI's practices and operations, have been kept secret.

It has however been public knowledge since 1991 that French soldiers were training members of the Rwandese forces, though it is only now that they have been incriminated in training members of death squads. French officials have in the past denied to Amnesty International any knowledge of death squads organized by the Rwandese President who was killed last April.

The human rights organization is concerned that the Rwandese security forces trained by DAMI, and any militia also trained by DAMI, have been responsible for extrajudicial executions, "disappearances" and torture since October 1990. Furthermore these units have been largely responsible for carrying out mass murder of government opponents and members of the Tutsi ethnic group over the past two and a half months.

Amnesty International documented over 2,300 cases of extrajudicial execution by members of the security forces and militia in Rwanda, as well as cases of torture, between October 1990 and the onset of killings on an even more massive scale on 6 April 1994.
