ORAL STATEMENT Item 6: Consideration of UPR reports: Sierra Leone

UN Human Rights Council 48th session 13 September – 8 October 2021

Madam President,

Amnesty International welcomes the acceptance of at least 218 out of 274 recommendations received by Sierra Leone in its third review, aimed at improving the human rights landscape in the country.¹

In particular, we welcome the recent abolition of the death penalty, as recommended by several states,² and to expedite the Gender Equality Bill, currently awaiting Parliamentary debate and approval.³ We also applaud Sierra Leone's reported change of position to accept a recommendation to enact legislation for the protection of human rights defenders.⁴

Madam President,

We are however appalled that Sierra Leone has not accepted numerous recommendations on the eradication of female genital mutilation (FGM) which is a violation of the rights of women and girls.⁵ This entrenched cultural practice has resulted in a huge drop out of girls from schools, promoted early and forced marriage and often results in preventable maternal death.

We are also concerned at the slow progress in the implementation of recommendations made in the previous review on expediting the constitutional review.⁶ Although there is a cabinet

conclusion on the recommendations, we urge that the process be fast tracked in order to implement accepted recommendations from the second and third UPR reviews.

Madam President,

In closing, we wish to express our regret that, once again, Sierra Leone merely noted recommendations to adopt measures to guarantee the human rights of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex persons and to decriminalize same-sex relations between consenting adults.⁷ We call on Sierra Leone to reconsider its position on these recommendations.
