# Mamum al-Humsi, prisoner of conscience on hunger strike Syria

## **Amnesty International's concerns**

Amnesty International has learnt that Mamum al-Humsi, prisoner of conscience and former parliamentarian, started a hunger-strike on 9 December 2002 to protest treatment he is receiving in prison. Amnesty International renews its call for his immediate release and for any medical treatment he may require, in particular because Mamum al-Humsi suffers from diabetes.

#### **Background information**

Mamum al-Humsi was arrested on 9 August 2001 and charged with offences including "attempting to change the constitution by illegal means". In March 2002 he was sentenced to five years' imprisonment and continues to be held at 'Adra prison near Damascus. He has recently started a hunger-strike to protest the treatment he is receiving in prison. He was, for example, not allowed any family visits when 'Eid, which marks the end of Ramadan, was celebrated. He reportedly is not allowed regular exercise or access to newspapers or radio. Several political prisoners are also reported to have been held in solitary confinement and not have access to appropriate medical care.

#### Recommendations

Please write letters in Arabic, French, English or your own language to the authorities below, using professionally-headed paper if you use this in your profession:

- Introducing yourself in your professional capacity and/or as a member of Amnesty International;
- Referring to your previous letter (if applicable);
- Expressing concern at reports that Mamum al-Humsi, held in 'Adra prison, is on hungerstrike and asking for information on his current health;
- Urging the authorities to provide him with access to appropriate medical care;
- Calling on the authorities to release Mamum al-Humsi who has been imprisoned for the peaceful expression of his opinion.
