**Further Information on UA 207/03 (ASA 16/17/2003, 11 July 2003) Fear for safety/incommunicado detention/fear of torture or ill-treatment**

Daw Mae Hnin Kyi and two female organizers of the National League for Democracy (NLD) Women's division have been released from custody. They were reportedly detained incommunicado and interrogated for 24 hours, along with at least four other women from the NLD Women's Division.

Concerns remain for the safety of ten men, U Khin Win, U Maung Maung, Ko Than Aung, Ko Aung Thein Myint, Than Tun, Kyaw Kyaw Lwin, Aung Than, Kyaw Kyaw, U Hnout Khan Hmwe, and Win Naing, who are reportedly being held in incommunicado detention, following their call for the release of persons held after the violent attack on the National League for Democracy (NLD) on 30 May, and for an investigation into the attack.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

On 30 May 2003 members of the NLD travelling on party business in Upper Myanmar were violently attacked in what is believed to be a premeditated attack. Authorities confirmed that four people had been killed; according to other sources the true figure could be significantly higher.

Six weeks after the attack, at least 130 people who were among those attacked remain missing or in detention, including party secretary Daw Aung San Suu Kyi. Many reportedly suffered head injuries and have had no access to relatives or lawyers. While the International Committee of the Red Cross has publicly stated that in late June 2003 it was granted permission to visit at least 30 of the detainees, it has not been given access to Daw Aung San Suu Kyi. Following the attack, Amnesty International is aware that at least 55 further people were reportedly taken into incommunicado detention. NLD offices have been closed down, members and supporters of the NLD as well as other political organizations are reportedly under intensive surveillance. The press is strictly controlled by authorities in Myanmar, and there is no free access to information, including news about the events on 30 May 2003.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send appeals to arrive as quickly as possible, in English or your own language:**

- welcoming the release of Daw Mae Hnin Kyi and two other members of the NLD Women's Division

- expressing concern at the arrest of four NLD township organizers in Yenanchaung, Magway Division, and six persons in Kawthaung, Tanintharyi Division, following their call for the release of persons detained after a violent attack on the NLD on 30 May 2003 and for an investigation into the incident;
- urging authorities to either charge those arrested with a recognizably criminal offence or immediately and unconditionally release them;
- calling on authorities not to penalize people for peacefully exercising their right to freedom of expression, association and assembly;
- calling for an end to arrests of on this basis;
- calling for guarantees that no detainees will be tortured or ill-treated, and that they be granted immediate access to lawyers, doctors, and relatives.
