



HUMAN RIGHTS FACTS AND FIGURES 2013

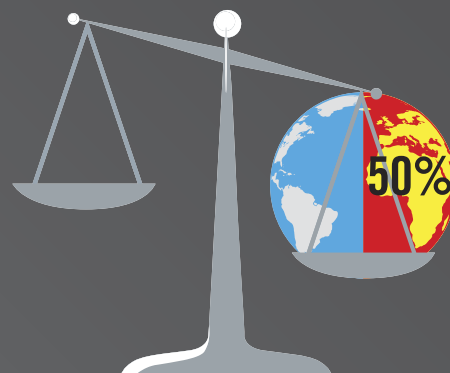

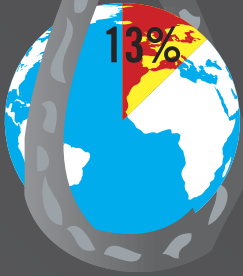
155 STATES VOTED TO ADOPT THE ARMS TRADE TREATY AT THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN APRIL 2013



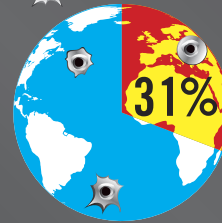
ONLY **3 COUNTRIES** VOTED AGAINST THE TREATY

PRACTICE BY THE END OF 2012



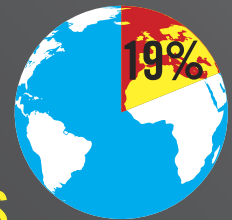
