**Further Information on UA 47/05 (AFR 54/026/2005, 24 February 2005) and follow-up ( (AFR 54/027/2005, 28 February 2005) - Detention without charge/Fear of Safety/Possible Prisoner of Conscience**

**SUDAN            Salah Mohamed Abdelrahman (m) - released**

On 11 August, Salah Mohamed Abdelrahman was released from Kober prison in Khartoum North after more than eight months in detention without charge. He had been arrested on 24 January along with Dr Mudawi Ibrahim Adam who was officially released on 3 March.

Salah Mohamed Abdelrahman was held for more than two months in a house near Kober prison. (The house was nicknamed "Abu Ghraib" as there were several reports of torture taking place there.) Salah Mohamed Abdelrahman was reportedly interrogated about his political activities and also subjected to torture. He was allowed visits by his family on two occasions at the house before he was transferred to Kober prison.

Salah Mohamed Abdelrahman has the following message for Amnesty International members "Thank you for your solidarity and humanity in ending my suffering, I am very grateful for all you efforts."
