**Brazil: Trade Unionists arrested - Legal Concern**

AI has received reports that some of the trade unionists arrested in connection with the metal workers strike have now been released, although others still remain in detention. The strike now appears to be weakening and it is thought that it could continue for only about another twenty days.

The strikers in Santo André have now voted to end the strike and return to work. All of those detained from the Santo André union have now been released with the once exception of José Maria de Almeida who is still in detention in DOPS (Departamento de Ordem Política e Social) in São Paulo. He has reportedly confessed to being a member of the Convergencia Socialista (a movement for democratic socialism) and he is being held while further investigations take place.

The strikers in São Bernardo have however voted to continue the strike and some of the leaders of the São Bernardo and Diadema Metal Workers' Union are still in detention, including the President, Luis Inacio da Silva ("Lula"). Those still being detained are being charged with "incitement to strike" under article 36 of the Law of National Security and the cases are being considered by a military magistrate. The Union is meeting on 9 May 1980 to discuss whether the strike should continue.

AI has also received disturbing reports of short-term arrests of trade unionists in São Bernardo; applications for habeas have been successful and those detained are being held by the Federal Police, not in DOPS. There have also been reports of violent behaviour by the police towards trade unionists; three people were reportedly hospitalised after being beaten by police during a May Day demonstration.

Further recommended action: For those who still maintain an interest in these cases, please reiterate your concern about the application of the Law of National Security for peaceful trade union activities and that several trade unionists still remain in detention.
