Africa: Invitation to a press conference on the launch of a report on policing in Southern Africa

Amnesty International invites journalists to the launch its report: Policing to protect human rights: A survey of police practices in the countries of the Southern Africa Development Community, 1997 -2002.

The report is being launched in connection with the start of a campaign involving Amnesty International members and other civil society organizations in member countries of the Southern African Development Community (SADC), together with Amnesty International's membership worldwide.

The report includes a survey of human rights and policing in 12 of the member states of SADC. It shows that human rights violations by the police continue to occur in the majority of SADC countries. It also notes efforts by individual countries to increase protection for human rights, as well as initiatives undertaken by the Southern African Regional Police Chiefs' Cooperation Organization (SARPCCO) to promote best practice through training programs and the development of a code of conduct.

It recommends specific actions that should be taken by governments and police authorities to ensure that police respect the rights of all communities without distinction.
