BURUNDIPaul Nsanzurwimo Emile Masabo

Paul Nsanzurwimo and Emile Masabo were released from Cibitoke military camp, where they had been illegally held, on 27 or 28 March, on the orders of the Commander of the $1^{\rm st}$ Military region.

However, Emile Masabo has since been detained again, and is now in military custody in Maramvya, Mutimbuzi commune, close to the capital, Bujumbura. It is not clear why Emile Masabo is still in custody.

Both men were beaten shortly after they were arrested, while held at a military position in Mubone zone, close to Bujumbura. They were subsequently transferred to Cibitoke military camp in northern Burundi, where they were detained incommunicado.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/ airmail letters in French or your own language (please check that postal services are operating to Burundi from your country):

- welcoming the release of Paul Nsanzurwimo;
- asking why Emile Masabo is still in custody, now in Maramvya, Mutimbuzi commune, and urging that he be immediately released, if he is not to be charged with a recognizably criminal offence;
- seeking quarantees that he will not be ill-treated in detention;
- calling for an investigation into the circumstances of the men's arrest and illegal detention in Cibitoke military camp;
- calling for their ill-treatment in military custody in Mubone to be investigated and for those responsible to be brought to justice;
- calling on the authorities to take urgent measures to ensure that members of the armed forces follow proper arrest and detention procedures.
