The four members of a banned human rights organization, <u>CAP Liberté</u>, named above, are believed to have been released by March 1992. Amnesty International considered them to be prisoners of conscience, detained because of their non-violent opposition to the government.

Jean-Michel Nintcheu, Emmanuel Wato and Feuneu Feuzing were arrested on 3 January 1992, and Tafou Martin on 23 January 1992, in Douala. All four were held without charge at the <u>Commissariat du premier arrondissement</u> (First district police station), where Jean-Michel Nintcheu and Emmanuel Wato were reported to have been severely ill-treated at the time of their arrest.
