ETHIOPIAMahmoud Ali Said (known as "Saido"), aged 45, farmer

Mahmoud Ali Said ("Saido") is seriously ill in prison in Dire Dawa town in eastern Ethiopia, as a result of denial of medical treatment for injuries sustained as a result of torture. He is a farmer and owner of a tea-shop in the nearby small town of Burka Tirtira, and is married with 11 children.

Mahmoud Ali Said "disappeared" in May 1995 in Dire Dawa after being abducted in Burka Tirtira by unidentified security agents. In January 1997, after 20 months in secret detention he was transferred to the central prison in Dire Dawa. He has never been taken to court or charged with any offence.

He is reportedly seriously ill with hepatitis and gastritis, and wounds from torture inflicted while in secret detention. He is said to be unable to stand or walk. For the whole time in secret detention, he was denied medical treatment.

Mahmoud Ali Said was evidently detained on suspicion of having links with the Oromo Liberation Front (OLF), which is in armed opposition to the government in Oromia Region (Region Four). He belongs to the Oromo nationality (or ethnic group) and was detained without trial for eight years up to 1991 under the former Dergue government on similar grounds. He has reportedly denied providing material support to OLF guerrilla forces fighting the new government since 1992.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There have been reports in the past three or more years of numerous detentions, torture and extrajudicial executions of unarmed civilians in this and other parts of Oromia Region who were suspected of links with OLF groups fighting government forces.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or your own language:

- expressing concern that Mahmoud Ali Said ("Saido") is seriously ill as a result of torture injuries and denial of medical treatment during 20 months of secret detention;
- appealing for him to be given urgent medical treatment and admission to hospital, and regular access to his family;
- expressing concern that he has been detained secretly and unlawfully for over 20 months without charge and trial, and calling for his release if there is no evidence to charge him with a recognizable criminal offence;
- calling for full and impartial investigation into his torture, and for anyone found responsible to be brought to justice.
