Amnesty International can confirm that all the above, except Tajudin Abdullahi and Usmael Umar, were released without charge a few days after being arrested in late September/early October 1993. Some were allegedly beaten and ill-treated.

Tajudin Abdullahi and Usmael Umar are still detained without charge or formal legal status in Hurso "rehabilitation camp" near Dire Dawa. Hurso is a large detention centre where over three thousand suspected members of the Oromo Liberation Front (OLF) are reportedly detained to make them denounce the OLF or renounce their alleged membership of the OLF. Detainees are mostly refused visits from their relatives but the International Committee of the Red Cross has access to the detention centre where conditions are reportedly harsh.

The OLF is fighting government forces in parts of the Oromia region, including the areas around Dire Dawa and Harar in Eastern Ethiopia, where there have been mass arrests of Oromo civilians in recent months. Amnesty International believes that many of those detained, including Tajuddin Abdullahi and Usmael Umar, may have been arrested arbitrarily and not on the basis of evidence of actual involvement with the OLF's armed opposition.

## FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

- welcoming the release of all but two of the Oromo Relief Association staff in Dire Dawa;

- asking for the reasons for the continued detention without charge or trial of Tajuddin Abdullahi and Usmael Umar, and expressing concern that they may be prisoners of conscience;

- urging that they be released without further delay if they are not to be charged with a recognizable criminal offence;

- requesting that they are treated humanely and given regular access to their families, lawyers and representatives of ORA.
