Amnesty International very much welcomes the news that Ahmed Mohamed, the ORA Field Coordination Officer in Dire Dawa in eastern Ethiopia, was released in early October 1996. He had "disappeared" on 15 February 1996 after obeying an instruction to report to the army offices in Dire Dawa. He was released from detention without having been brought to court or charged or allowed any family visits. No further details are yet available.

No further action by the UA Network is requested. Many thanks to all who sent appeals to the Ethiopian authorities -- they did not reply or acknowledge or explain Ahmed Mohamed's "disappearance", but we believe your actions secured his safety and eventual release.
