Amnesty International has learned of the release without charge of Yaredson Ngwira, an accountant employed by the Southern Africa Trade Union Coordination Council (SATUCC). It also appears that reports of the arrest of SATUCC employee Frank Mkandawire were incorrect and that he remains at liberty. No further action is required on their behalf. Thank you to all those who sent appeals.

Chakufwa Chihana, secretary general of SATUCC, remains detained without charge, probably in Zomba Central Prison. He has received visits from an international trade union delegation and from his lawyer, and appears to be in reasonable health. However, on 2 June 1992 police for the third time defied a High Court order requiring them to produce Chakufwa Chihana and explain the legal basis for his continued imprisonment.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/airmail letters

- calling on the government to produce Chakufwa Chihana before a court of law and give reasons for his continuing imprisonment in compliance with the order of the High Court;
- urging his immediate and unconditional release as a prisoner of conscience.
