Amnesty International is seeking confirmation that all the islamist activists arrested on or around the 25 September 1994 have been released. This is believed to be the case in view of reports that the detainees were granted a presidential pardon after 10 of them apparently confessed to belonging to secret islamic organizations, such as the *Organisation du Jihad en Mauritanie*, Mauritanian Organization for Jihad, whose aim was reportedly to take over power. Some of those detained are believed to have been subjected to torture.

More than 60 islamist activists, including some foreign nationals, were detained and held incommunicado for up to 16 days. Amnesty International believes that at least some had no prior involvement in using or advocating violence and were therefore prisoners of conscience.

No further action by the Urgent Action Network is requested at present. Thank you to all who sent appeals.
