- Approx. 140 from Shell

What is corrosion and what is sabotage/theft?

Shell's figures for 2010, 2011 and 2012 are as follows:

Corrosion	42	37	32	64	36
Sabotage and theft	115	95	112	118	137

Companies blame most spills on sabotage and theft of oil. Amnesty International's research shows the basis for this is not legitimate. Many spills are due to sabotage and theft but there is evidence that spills due to corrosion are equipment failure are under-reported.

However, even if we accept Shell's figures, the company has had between 32 and 64 corrosion spills per year, which in itself is a very high figure and leads to questions about why.
