Amnesty International has just learned that Jean-Pierre Mugabe, Editor-in-Chief of Le Tribun du peuple newspaper and André Kameya, Editor-in-Chief of <u>Rwanda Rushya</u> newspaper were granted provisional releases on 3 April 1992.

Jean-Pierre Mugabe, first arrested on 31 December 1991 in the capital, Kigali, was released on 1 January 1992 and rearrested the following day. He remains under provisional release pending an appeal against his sentence and conviction. His appeal will be heard by the Kigali Appeal Court (*Cour d'appel*) on 23 May 1992.

After issuing the previous update on this group of journalists, Amnesty International discovered that André Kameya and Théoneste Muberantwari were arrested on 24 and 25 February 1992 respectively. André Kameya was accused of publishing an article which reportedly alleged that the <u>Parti pour la libération du peuple Hutu</u> (PALIPEHUTU), a prohibited political party formed by Burundi exiles, had a training base in Rwanda. He was charged with endangering the security of the state (*atteinte à la surêté de l'Etat*) and remains under provisional release pending his trial. Théoneste Muberantwari, who had been in hiding for two months, was arrested for publishing cartoons which "insulted" the Head of State and is still being held.

No further appeals are necessary on behalf of the other six journalists named above, thank you to all those who took action on their behalf.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters, in FRENCH if possible:

- welcoming reports that Jean-Pierre Mugabe and André Kameya have been released, calling for the charges against Jean-Pierre Mugabe to be dropped and requesting details of the charges against André Kameya;

- expressing concern that Théoneste Muberantwari is still being held apparently because he exercised his right to freedom of expression in pursuit of his profession as a journalist;

- urging the authorities to release Théoneste Muberantwari without undue delay or, if he has been charged with a recognizably criminal offence, to ensure that he is promptly given a fair trial.
