SUDAN: ARREST WAR CRIMES SUSPECTS NOW





Your Excellency,

On 27 April 2007, the International Criminal Court (ICC) issued two arrest warrants for Sudanese government minister **Ahmad Harun** and Janjawid leader **Ali Kushayb**.

Both men are suspected of crimes against humanity and war crimes committed in Darfur, including murder, rape and torture.

The Sudanese authorities have refused to arrest the men and surrender them to the ICC for trial, even though UN Security Council Resolution 1593 requires them to co-operate with the ICC.

I urge the UN Security Council to:

them and surrender them to the ICC:

- condemn Sudan's refusal to arrest and surrender Ahmad Harun and Ali Kushayb to the ICC;
- call on Sudan to enforce all ICC arrest warrants immediately;
- if the men travel outside Sudan, call on those states to arrest
- take other effective measures to ensure that the two men are found and surrendered to the ICC.
