## Further information on UA 112/99 (AFR 57/06/99, 18 May 1999) - Fear of torture / Fear for safety / Prisoner of conscience

## TOGONADJOMBE Antoine Koffi, human rights defender

Nadjombe Antoine Koffi, a Togolese member of Amnesty International, was released from detention on 18 June 1999.

While Amnesty International welcomes his release it is nevertheless concerned that it is provisional pending police enquiries into his case.

The organization considered Nadjombe Koffi to be a prisoner of conscience detained solely because of his human rights work for the organization, and is calling for charges of *dénonciation calomnieuse et atteinte à l'honneur* (false accusations and libel) brought against him to be dropped immediately.

His arrest was connected to an Amnesty International report published in May (État de Terreur, State of Terror, AFR 57/01/99, 5 May 1999) accusing the government of allowing the security forces to carry out grave human rights violations with impunity before, during and after the elections in 1998.

Tengue Nestor, Gayibor François and Sant'Anna Brice, who were arrested on 3 May in connection with the same report, were also provisionally released from detention on 18 June (see EXTRA 58/99, AFR 57/04/99, 7 May 1999).

No further action by the UA network is requested but appeal writers may send telexes, faxes, express or airmail letters in French or in your own language: - welcoming the provisional release of Nadjombe Antoine Koffi on 18 June 1999; - expressing concern that he was a prisoner of conscience, detained solely because of his human rights work; - urging the authorities to drop immediately all charges against him; - calling on the authorities to give immediate and unconditional guarantees for the safety of members of Amnesty International and other human rights defenders in Togo; - urging the authorities to ensure that human rights defenders in Togo are allowed to carry out their work without hindrance.
