Zaïre About 20 soldiers arrested at Zaïre radio station following alleged coup attempt.

<u>UA 42/92 Incommunicado detention/ill-treatment concern</u>

At least 20 soldiers have been held at Camp Tshatshi and various other detention centres in the capital, Kinshasa, following an alleged coup attempt on 22 January 1992. They were among a group of rebel soldiers who briefly occupied the complex of the national radio station La Voix du Zaïre (the Voice of Zaïre). They demanded the resignation of President Mobutu Sese Seko and the Prime Minister Nguza Karl-i-Bond and appealed for foreign military intervention and the resumption of Zaïre's National Conference, following its suspension on 19 January 1992. The soldiers have since been held incommunicado. Detainees held incommunicado in the past in Zaïre have been subjected to torture and other forms of cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment.

Troops loyal to the government recaptured the radio station two hours later. The authorities said that two of the rebel soldiers were killed. The government has claimed that the opposition <u>Union pour la democracie et le progrès social</u>, (UPDS) Union for Democracy and Social Progress, was involved, but the opposition has denied any links with the rebel soldiers.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The occupation of the radio station followed the suspension of Zaïre's National Conference by the Prime Minister Nguza. The National Conference is composed of several hundred political parties and other groups and was started in August 1991 to review and reform Zaïre's political system. Opponents of the government have insisted that the National Conference continue and have called for a campaign of civil disobedience to oblige the government to allow its continuation. It had previously been stopped in September 1991 following army-led looting and violence in most Zairian towns, but resumed in December 1991.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/ express and airmail letters in FRENCH, if possible:

- expressing concern about reports of incommunicado detention of soldiers arrested in connection with the occupation of the radio station on 22 January 1992;
- asking the authorities to make public the identities and places of detention of those arrested;
- enquiring whether they have been charged with specific offences and when they will be bought to trial;
- -seeking assurances that the detainees are not being ill-treated and that they will be allowed prompt access to legal advice and their relatives.
