N'sii Luanda Shandwe (m), human rights defender

Human rights defender N'sii Luanda Shandwe was released on 26 January, having spent nine months as a prisoner of conscience at Kinshasa's main prison, the *Centre pénitentiaire et de réeducation de Kinshasa* (CRPK), Kinshasa Penitentiary and Reeducation Centre. He had been detained as a result of his human rights activism, but was never formally charged with a criminal offence. He was in good health on his release, having undergone an operation for appendicitis last September.

His release appears to have been a measure of presidential grace, announced on the second anniversary of President Joseph Kabila's accession to power. In a letter written after his release, N'sii Luanda Shandwe thanked Amnesty International members throughout the world for the support they had given him during his detention. "Perhaps they can't quite imagine how much courage, moral comfort, protection and happiness their actions gave me," he wrote. "I will remain forever grateful...".
