Amnesty International has received confirmation of the release of Bertin Lukanda and Dieudonné Asumani (corrected name), believed to have taken place on 8 September 1997.

Sources in the DRC report that Bertin Lukanda was dangerously ill on release from detention, after having been severely beaten and starved. His release was allegedly ordered by a high-ranking military official in Kinshasa. He is now recovering from his ordeal in detention.

Dieudonné Asumani was also reportedly beaten in detention, but he is reported to be recovering from the ill-treatment, as is Diomba Ramazani.

No inquiries into the allegations of torture are known to have taken place.

Many thanks to all who have participated in this action, which is thought to have contributed to the release of the three men.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send a final round of letters in French/English or in your own language:

- welcoming the release of the three men named above, but expressing grave concern at reports that they were tortured and ill-treated. Urge that an inquiry establish the facts of their arrest and detention and those responsible for human rights violations such as torture be identified and brought to justice.
