Amnesty International is seriously concerned for the safety of Dr Elma Novais and her children Jefferson and Roxana, following what appears to be a campaign of veiled threats and intimidation against them. This campaign appears designed to intimidate Dr Novais who has been working tirelessly to bring to justice those responsible for killing her son, Josenildo João de Freitas Júnior. He was shot dead in Caruaru, Pernambuco in 1999 by a group of men who witnesses described as military policemen.

On the afternoon of 17 December 2002, while Dr Novais was waiting at traffic lights in a car with her police escort (she receives police protection during the day, but not at night), a young boy detonated an extremely loud firework next to her car, before running away. The firework seems to have been let off solely with the intention of intimidating Dr Novais. The next day, a black car pulled up outside her house. Two men got out and walked towards the house, but made a quick getaway after seeing that she was accompanied by a police officer.

On 27 December, Dr Novais' son Jefferson was detained without reason by military policemen at his place of work in the neighbouring town of Arcoverde. The police officers, who initially alleged that his papers were not in order, later claimed that he was a fugitive from a local prison. He was only released after intervention by the Pernambuco State Secretary for Social Defence. Police officers at the station, who refused to speak to Dr Novais, said that they had made a mistake.

On the same day Dr Novais' 13 year old daughter Roxana, who was out shopping in Caruaru, received a telephone call on her mobile phone from someone claiming to be Jefferson, her brother. The voice asked her to go as quickly as possible to her mother's house where he was waiting. At the time however, Jefferson was in police detention in Arcoverde. The caller asked her to describe the clothes that she was wearing, so that they could come and pick her up. Roxana did not follow these instructions.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Four police officers were arrested and charged with the murder of Josenildo João de Freitas Júnior in December 2001, after a national TV program broadcast an exposé on corrupt police in Caruaru. They were released in October 2002. Prior to their release, Amnesty International wrote to the Brazilian authorities expressing concern about numerous apparent irregularities in the judicial proceedings.

Dr Novais is well known for her efforts to bring to justice those responsible for killing her son. Since the release of the police officers accused of his murder, Dr Novais has received frequent messages saying that she will be left in peace if she drops her interest in the case. She has appealed against their release, but the appeal appears to have been delayed in the public prosecutor's office. Legal proceedings for defamation have also been brought against her. An Amnesty International delegation that spoke to detainees in Caruaru prison in April 2002 received numerous denunciations of torture and extortion naming some of the same police officers charged with the murder of Josenildo João de Freitas Júnior. GAJOP, an NGO based in the state capital Recife, is submitting the case to the Inter -American Commission on Human Rights.

The activities of criminals and corrupt police officers in Brazil are often supported by the activities of death squads who execute to order. Death squad members are often police officers, or individuals who act with the collusion of the police.

# **RECOMMENDED ACTION:** Please send appeals to arrive as quickly as possible, in Portuguese or your own language:

- expressing your concern for the safety of Dr Elma Novais, her children Jefferson José de Freitas and Roxana Novais, and calling on the authorities to take appropriate steps, in accordance with their wishes, to protect them;

- calling for a full, prompt and impartial investigation into the illegal detention of Jefferson José de Freitas in Arcoverde on 3 January 2003, and calling for full disciplinary measures to be brought against those military policemen found responsible;

- calling for full investigations into all other allegations of threats against Dr Novais and her family;

- noting that Dr Novais receives military police protection but urging the authorities to provide her with 24 hour police protection;

- expressing your concern that despite the existence of substantial material evidence and eyewitnesses, that those responsible for the murder of Josenildo João de Freitas Júnior still have not been brought to justice;

- politely asking the authorities to inform you of the current status of the investigations into his murder;

- calling on the authorities to open a full, prompt and impartial investigation into military police corruption and death squad activity in Caruaru, that the results of these investigations be made public, and that those responsible be brought to justice.
