CHILE: Juan Domingo SALVO ZúÑIGA, peasant

Amnesty International has learned that on 19 October 1992, the Supreme Court confirmed the death sentence against Juan Domingo Salvo Zúñiga. His case will now be heard by President Patricio Aylwin, who has the power to commute the sentence. President Aylwin recently commuted death sentences against three Peruvians.

Juan Salvo Zúniga was sentenced to death in April 1992 by the Appeals Court in the town of La Serena for the murders of Antonia del Carmen Cabrera Gómez and her three children.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

After taking office in March 1990, the civilian government of President Aylwin proposed the abolition of the death penalty. In December 1990 this proposal was rejected by the Senate. In January 1992 the Senate introduced a proposal for the extension of the death penalty to include the murder of off-duty carabineros, the uniformed police. In July 1992, the Chamber of Deputies rejected this extension. The bill is now to be discussed by a mediating body, the Comisión Mixta, a mixed commission made up of members of both Chambers.

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman and degrading punishment, as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

## FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

- respectfully requesting that President Aylwin exercises his power of clemency and commutes the death sentence against Juan Salvo Zúñiga;
- stating that Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases without reservation, on the grounds that it is the ultimate cruel, inhuman and degrading punishment;
- calling for the total abolition of the death penalty in Chile in line with the worldwide trend.
