# UA 54/91 Death Threats

COLOMBIA : Monica SANCHEZ ARRIETA, human rights lawyer

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of human rights lawyer Monica Sánchez Arrieta following reported threats to her life.

According to reports, on 5 February 1991 Mónica Sánchez Arrieta received anonymous messages on her automatic telephone answer machine threatening her with death and accusing her of defending guerrillas ("<u>defensora de</u> <u>guerrilleros</u>"). Two days later she received a <u>sufragio</u>, an invitation to her own funeral, dated 10 February 1991. Since then she has reportedly been followed.

Mónica Sánchez has worked as a human rights lawyer in Medellín, capital of Antioquia department for some six years. In her work as a lawyer with the Political Prisoners Solidarity Committee, <u>Comité de Solidaridad con los Presos</u> <u>Políticos</u>, (CSPP), she defends political prisoners and investigates cases of human rights violations including extrajudicial execution, "disappearance" and torture in which members of the Colombian security forces are implicated.

The threats have been denounced to the Procurator of Antioquia, the Human Rights Commission of the Procurator General's Office (<u>Comisión de Derechos</u> <u>Humanos de la Procuraduría General</u>), and the Human Rights Commission of National Criminal Instruction Office (<u>Comisión de Derechos Humanos de la Dirección</u> Nacional de Instrucción Criminal).

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On 4 July 1990 human rights lawyer with the CSPP in Bogotá Dr. Alirio Pedraza Becerra "disappeared" following his detention by armed men in Bogotá. Two of the armed men reportedly identified themselves to two police agents who stood by during his abduction. His whereabouts remain unknown. Since Dr. Pedraza's "disappearance" a number of human rights workers have received death threats. On 10 July a man reportedly telephoned Elvia Urán Vda. de Beltrán, a long-time member of a human rights group in Medellin, threatening that if she did not stop her work with political prisoners she would suffer the same fate as Dr. Pedraza. Later that evening another human rights lawyer, Martha Luz Saldarriaga, also received anonymous death threats by telephone.

### RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

- expressing concern for the safety of Monica Sánchez Arrieta following receipt of death threats, apparently because of her human rights work;

- asking that an immediate investigation be conducted into the death threats against her in order to identify those responsible and bring them to justice.
