UA 54/96 Fear for safety / "Disappearance" 29 February 1996

COLOMBIAConrrado Urrego Cifuentes

Conrrado Urrego Cifuentes has not been seen since he was abducted on 26 February 1996 by approximately 10 armed men from his house in the Comuna Nor-oriente neighbourhood of Medellín, Antioquia Department.

At 11 pm on 26 February, armed men identifying themselves as members of the Fiscalia, the Attorney General's Office, forcibly entered the house of Conrrado Urrego looking for Fredy Manco, who was not there. Conrrado Urrego was forced to accompany the gunmen.

All efforts by his family to locate Conrrado Urrego through the Fiscalía; F-2, Police Intelligence; Unidad Anti-secuestro y Extorsión (UNASE), Anti-kidnapping and Extortion Unit; Servicio de Investigaciones Judiciales e Inteligencia (SIJIN), Judicial Investigation and Intelligence Service; and through the Departamento Administrativo de Seguridad (DAS), Civilian Security Department, have been unsuccessful and his whereabouts remain unknown.

The family has denounced his "disappearance" to the regional authorities.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In recent years widespread and systematic human rights violations have occurred in Colombia, including extrajudicial executions, "disappearance", torture and arbitrary arrest. President Ernesto Samper Pizano, who assumed office on 7 August 1994, has publicly stated that tackling the human rights situation will be a priority for his government. However, members of the Colombian armed and security forces, together with their paramilitary allies, continue to commit serious abuses with virtual impunity. Only exceptionally are perpetrators brought to justice; the vast majority of members of the armed and security forces responsible for gross human rights violations remain in active service.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of Conrrado Urrego and urging an immediate investigation to establish his whereabouts;
- calling for a full and impartial investigations into his "disappearance", and calling for the results to be made public and for the perpetrators to be brought to justice;
- urging that, if he is in detention, he be treated humanely and allowed access to lawyers, relatives and medical treatment;
- asking that he be charged with a recognizable criminal offence or immediately released.
