UA 77/00Fear for Safety / Possible "Disappearance" / Killing 5 April 2000

COLOMBIAMembers of the Indigenous *Embera-Katío* communities in Antioquia Department

Killed:

Rubén Darío BAILARÍN, aged 12

Amnesty International is seriously concerned for the safety of the indigenous <code>Embera-Katío</code> communities in the department of Antioquia who are being attacked both by paramilitary forces, who operate with the support or acquiescence of the security forces, and armed opposition groups. Neither side in the long-running armed conflict accept the community's right not to be drawn into the conflict.

On 26 March 2000, community member Remigio Bailarín was reportedly abducted by paramilitaries belonging to the *Autodefensas Unidas de Colombia* (AUC), United Self-Defence Groups of Colombia. His whereabouts remain unknown and Amnesty International is very concerned for his safety.

On the 28 March the body of 12-year-old Rubén Darío Bailarín was found in a rural area between the towns of Frontino and Dabeiba in northwest Antioquia. It appears he had been shot by paramilitaries.

These latest attacks on the Embera-Katío community follow reports of an increased paramilitary presence around the town of Dabeiba and neighboring towns in the department of Antioquia (see UA 61/00, AMR 23/14/00).

On 6 February Guillermo Niasa, an indigenous leader of the Embera-Katío community, and his 12-year-old son, Ivan Niasa Domicó, were reportedly killed by the armed opposition group: Fuerzas Armadas Revolucionarias de Colombia (FARC), Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia, near to the town of Ríosucio, in the neighbouring Department of Chocó.

On 9 March Amnesty International issued an Urgent Action on behalf of indigenous rights activist Jairo Bedoya Hoyos, who "disappeared" on 2 March 2000 in Medellín, capital of Antioquia Department (see UA 59/00, AMR 23/11/00, 9 March 2000). As a member of the Organización Indígena de Antioquia (OIA), Indigenous Organization of Antioquia, Jairo Bedoya Hoyos is involved in the "Para que Embera Viva", "For the Life of the Embera Indigenous People" campaign for the respect of the cultural rights and security of the community. It is believed that this work may have exposed him to attack from both the security forces and their paramilitary allies and armed opposition forces. His whereabouts remain unknown.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Peasant, black and indigenous communities living in disputed zones in Colombia's armed conflict are often attacked by both sides. In response to the lack of security faced by the indigenous communities in Antioquia, the OIA declared the communities's neutrality in an effort to get both sides to respect the safety of their members.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of the *Embera-Katio* community in Antioquia and calling on the authorities to take all appropriate steps, as agreed by the community, to quarantee their safety;
- condemning the killing, apparently by paramilitaries, of twelve year old Rubén Darío Bailarín, a member of the *Embera-Katio* community in Antioquia; expressing concern for the safety of Remigio Bailarín whose whereabouts are not known since he was reportedly abducted by paramilitaries 26 March 2000; calling on the authorities to take steps to secure the release of Remigio Bailarín;
- calling for full, prompt and impartial investigations into the abduction of Remigio Bailarín and the killing of 12-year-old Rubén Darío Bailarín, for the results to be made public and for those responsible to be brought to justice; condemning the killing of indigenous leader Guillermo Niasa and his son, reportedly by FARC guerrillas, calling for full, prompt and impartial investigations, for the results to be made public and for those responsible to be brought to justice.
