# Further information on UA 38/01 (AMR 23/017/2001, 9 February 2001) - Fear for Safety / Death Threats

## COLOMBIA Peace Brigades International Human rights activists with the Organización Femenina Popular (OFP)

Identity documents and mobile telephones confiscated by paramilitaries have been returned following international appeals. However, Amnesty International is still seriously concerned for the safety of those working for the *Organización Femenina Popular* (OFP), Popular Women's Organization, and other human rights organizations in Barrancabermeja following renewed threats.

In the afternoon of 9 February, an unidentified man came to the OFP offices in southeastern Barrancabermeja and handed over a parcel containing the identity documents and telephones that had been stolen the previous day. He said that the parcel had been given to him by some men, who told him to deliver it to OFP.

A few hours after the parcel was delivered two men approached two PBI volunteers accompanying members of the OFP and said that the events of the previous day had been a mistake and apologized for what had happened. A regional newspaper, The Vanguardia Liberal, has reported that paramilitary leaders with the Autodefensas Unidas de Colombia (AUC), United Self-Defense Groups of Colombia, deny having threatened OFP or PBI.

However, human rights organizations in Barrancabermeja continue to be under serious threat, and their members continue to be intimidated. For example, before the confiscated items were returned on the morning of 9 February, unidentified gunmen wearing plain clothes reportedly verbally abused and threatened a man who was delivering building supplies to the OFP. Shortly afterwards, OFP president Yolanda Becerra received an anonymous telephone call in which the caller ordered her to "attend a meeting with the paramilitary commander 'El Cabo'" ("asistir a una cita con el comandante paramilitar alias 'El Cabo'"). OFP has been ordered to attend meetings with the paramilitaries on several occasions in recent months, but have refused.

## FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please continue to send telegrams/telexes/ faxes/express/ airmail letters in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern about renewed intimidation of the OFP;

- urging the authorities to take appropriate measures to guarantee the safety of activists with the *Organización Femenina Popular* and Peace Brigades International;

calling for an immediate, impartial and full investigation to be carried out into the threats, with those responsible to be brought to justice;
expressing concern that even though a much publicized special forces unit was recently sent into Barrancabermeja, ostensibly to combat paramilitary forces, no decisive action has been taken against paramilitary forces in the city, whose whereabouts have been reported to the authorities;

- reminding the Colombian government to adhere to its obligations regarding human rights defenders, as laid out in United Nations (UN) and Organization of American States (OAS) declarations, and urging it to adhere to repeated recommendations made by the UN to the Colombian government to take measures to guarantee the safety of human rights defenders;

- calling for a full and impartial investigation into links between the security forces and paramilitary groups operating in the area, urging that the results are made public, and that those responsible for supporting and participating in such groups are brought to justice.
