UA 188/94 Possible "disappearance" / Fear for Safety 12 May 1994

COLOMBIA Francisco Eriberto GALVAN LOPEZ, aged 46 Manuel SOLERA Joaquín SOLERA

On 2 May 1994 Francisco Eriberto Galvan López, Manuel Solera and Joaquín Solera were abducted from their homes by a group of between 50 and 60 heavily armed men. They have not been seen since and there is serious concern for their safety.

Eye-witnesses report that the abductors, wearing a mixture of military and civilian dress, arrived at 4am in two large vehicles in the community of San Vicente del Congo in the municipality of Turbo in the heavily militarized Urabá region of Antioquia department. They identified themselves as members of a paramilitary "self-defence" group and reportedly had a list of people's names. Some of those whose names appeared on the list were forced out of their houses, including Francisco Galvan, Manuel Solera and Joaquín Solera. Francisco Galvan was reportedly forced out of his home when the armed men threatened to set fire to it. He was made to lie face down on the ground with his hands tied behind his back. He, Manuel Solera and Joaquín Solera were then driven to an unknown destination.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Urabá region of Antioquia department is located in the north-west of Colombia. For many years guerrilla groups have been active in the region and, as a result, there is a high presence there of both military and army-backed paramilitary groups. Many paramilitary groups have their origins in the civilian "self-defence" squads which the army created in the 1980s to act as auxiliaries during counter-insurgency operations. Over the past five years, several thousand civilians have been killed by paramilitary groups throughout the country. Although in 1989 the Colombian government suspended the legal base for the formation of paramilitary organizations and issued directives to the Colombia armed forces to combat and disband such groups, paramilitary forces have continued to kill and "disappear" perceived opponents with impunity in many areas of the country and continue to work with the support of the security forces.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the abduction and subsequent "disappearance" of Francisco Galvan, Manuel Solera and Joaquín Solera on 2 May 1994 from their homes in the community of San Vicente del Congo in the municipality of Turbo, Antioquia department;

- urging that if they are in detention, that they be humanely treated and allowed access to lawyers and relatives;

- urging that if in detention, that they be charged with a recognizable criminal offence or immediately released;

- urging that the government should immediately fulfil its commitment to disband paramilitary forces presently operating as auxiliaries of the armed forces or with armed forces' complicity. Members of such forces responsible for human rights violations should be brought to justice.
