Released:Gilberto Torres Martínez (m) - trade union leader

Trade union leader Gilberto Torres Martínez, was released on 7 April in the region of the Llanos Orientales of Colombia, near Monterrey, Casanare department. He was met by a humanitarian delegation which reportedly included members of the International Red Cross as well as members of other international and church non-governmental organisations (NGOs).

Gilberto Torres Martínez had been abducted on 25 February by members of the army-backed paramilitary group *Autodefensas Campesinas del Casanare* (ACC), Peasant Self-Defence Forces of Casanare.

During his captivity, members of the Oil Workers' Union (USO) and Ecopetrol workers, had asked national and international human rights organizations, to press the Colombian government to name a humanitarian delegation to mediate with the ACC for his release.

There is no further information on the whereabouts of oil workers José Antonio Pérez and Hernando Silva Cely, who were abducted by unidentified gunmen on 25 March.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send appeals to arrive as quickly as possible, in Spanish or your own language:

- urging the authorities to order an independent, impartial and conclusive investigation into the abduction of Gilberto Torres Martínez who was released on 7 April;

- urging them to take immediate action to ensure that José Antonio Pérez and Hernando Siva Cely are released unharmed,

- expressing concern for the safety of USO trade union activists and Ecopetrol employees in Casanare and throughout the country;

- asking the authorities what measures, deemed appropriate by those under threat themselves, they are going to take to guarantee the safety of those at risk.
