## COLOMBIA: About 150 human rights workers, trade unionists and grassroots leaders

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of about 150 human rights workers, trade unionists and leaders of grassroots organizations. According to information received, military intelligence in Colombia has compiled a list of some 150 individuals and institutions whom, it claims, are collaborators or supporters of guerilla groups in Colombia. This list has been passed by the Security Forces to Q.A.P., a Colombian Television station which intends to broadcast the list shortly.

There is concern that publication of the names of the individuals will put their lives at risk and will damage both their reputation and that of any organization or institution with which they are associated. Trade unionists, human rights workers and popular leaders have been a particular target for human rights violations, including extrajudicial execution, "disappearance", torture and maltreatment in recent years. In many cases the human rights violations against such individuals were preceded by the publication of inaccurate or distorted information about them in the media.

Lawyers from the <u>Comisión Andina de Juristas - sección Colombiana</u> - Andean Commission of Jurists, Colombian office, have presented to the courts an *acción de tutela*, a procedure intended to protect the constitutional rights of individuals. In the action, they point to rulings of the Constitutional Court which make it clear that information compiled by military intelligence or in the hands of the security forces should not be divulged to the media or to third parties but can only be used by the security forces themselves and in accordance with the constitutional rights of the individual.

The action calls on Judge Reporto of the  $\underline{\text{Juzgado Segundo Penal Municipal}}$  in Bogotá to prevent publication of the list in any form by the QAP TV station or by any other public media. It requests the Minstry of Defence and the security forces to refrain from divulging any information to the media or to third parties claiming links between individuals and guerilla organizations.

Many human rights organizations, trade unions and popular institutions are in the forefront of the defence of human rights in Colombia. Amnesty International is concerned that such accusations may discourage individuals from making public complaints about violations or pursuing them through the courts.

Several individuals working in the field of human rights have already been approached for information by correspondents of QAP. A lawyer from the <u>División Nacional de Quejas de la Defensoría del Pueblo</u> (National Complaints section of the Office of the Defender of the People) has confirmed both the existence of the material and the fact that it has been handed to the TV station.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish, English or your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of the 150 people named in the report compiled by military intelligence and made available to QAP TV station;

- urging that the authorities take appropriate steps to ensure that personal information on the individuals and institutions named in the report is not made public in breach of their constitutional rights and the rulings of the Constitutional Court;
- requesting a full impartial inquiry to determine how the information was obtained by the TV station and urging that administrative measures are taken against those responsible for such a breach of confidence.
