# COLOMBIA: William FRANCO DÁVILA

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of William Franco Dávila who has been missing since 28 September 1993, when 10 men visited his home in Tuluá, Valle Department, beat him up and forcibly took him away.

At 9.30pm on 28 September 1993, 10 men who identified themselves as agents of the Department of State Security, <u>Departamento Administrativo de Seguridad</u> (DAS) but who did not show any documentation to verify their identity, were taken to William Franco Dávila's home by another man. After beating William Franco Dávila up, they forcibly took him away. The DAS have not acknowledged the detention and his whereabouts remain unknown.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In recent years widespread and systematic human rights violations have occurred in Colombia, including torture, "disappearance" and extrajudicial execution. Particular targets have been members of left-wing parties, community and trade union leaders. The majority of such abuses have been attributed by the Colombian authorities to armed opposition groups or to civilian "death squads" which it claims it is unable to control. However, independent investigations have concluded that many such groups operate under the command or with the support of the Colombian armed and security forces. There is also evidence to suggest that members of the National Police are members of these "death squads".

# RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish, Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of William Franco Davila, who has not been seen since 28 September 1993, when he was taken from his home in Tuluá by 10 men, who identified themselves as members of the DAS;

- urging for an immediate and thorough inquiry into his whereabouts;

- urging that if he is in detention, that he be humanely treated and allowed access to lawyers and relatives;

- urging that if in detention, that he be charged with a recognizable criminal offence or released immediately.
