UA 363/92 <u>Torture/death threats</u> 20 November 1992 COLOMBIA: Wilson MÉNDEZ

Amnesty International has learned with concern of the reported torture of two men, Wilson Méndez and another, whose name is not known to the organization, following their detention by the Colombian armed forces in the town of Doncello, in the southern department of Caquetá, on 26 October 1992.

According to information received, Wilson Méndez and his companion were detained by members of the armed forces on suspicion of being guerrillas following an attack on the town by the armed opposition group <u>Fuerzas Armadas Revolucionarias de Colombia (FARC)</u>, Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia. They were taken to the base of the Florencia Battalion, <u>Batallón Florencia</u>, where they were reportedly subjected to torture. Wilson Méndez was shot in both legs in events which remain unclear. Reportedly as a result of protests by the local population, they were transferred to the local hospital, <u>Hospital María Inmaculada</u>, to be treated for their injuries. Wilson Méndez underwent an operation on both legs for fractures caused by the gunshot injuries. Eye-witnesses report that whilst they were still in hospital the soldiers guarding them attacked them in their beds, beating them with the butts of their guns, rebreaking Wilson Méndez' legs. Medical personnel intervened to stop the guards and reportedly received death threats as a result of their actions. Relatives of the two men have also received threats by paramilitary groups working with the army.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In September 1991 the Procurator General's office produced an official report which stating that more than 2,300 complaints had been lodged against the army and police in the last two years for human rights violations. President César Gaviria Trujillo, on presenting the report, stated:

"The government cannot fail to recognise the seriousness of the accusations made constantly and on a massive scale against its agents, nor ignore the extent of impunity in cases of human rights violations".

"No puede el Gobierno desconocer la gravedad de las acusaciones que se hacen en forma reiterada y masiva contra sus agentes, ni ignorar hasta que punto reina la impunidad por violación de derechos humanos."

However, despite the government's declared commitment to uphold respect for human rights, members of the Colombian armed and security forces continue to commit serious abuses, including torture, extrajudicial execution and "disappearance" with virtual impunity.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

either in Spanish, English or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the reported torture in detention of Wilson Méndez and another man who were both detained by the armed forces in Doncello, Caquetá, on 26 October 1992;

- expressing further concern at reports that the two men were severely beaten by their army guards whilst receiving hospital treatment for their injuries and that hospital staff were reportedly threatened when they intervened on behalf of the injured men;

- urging that there be an immediate and thorough investigation into both these events and that the results be made public and those found responsible brought to justice;

- urging that the government take all possible measures to protect the two men, their relatives and also the medical staff.
