COLOMBIA:Oliva BALLONA (female), peasant leader Avelino DOMÍNGUEZ, peasant leader OCtavio SIERRA, peasant farmer

Amnesty International has received information from the Colombian Presidential Adviser on Human Rights concerning the death threats against Oliva Ballona, Avelino Domínguez and Octavio Sierra.

Amnesty International was concerned at serious harassment and death threats against members of the civilian population, including the above-named peasant farmers and leaders, by members of the Colombian army and paramilitary forces under their command in the central Colombian Magdalena Medio region in September 1992.

Peasant farmers in the region have reportedly been told they must cooperate financially and actively with military and paramilitary forces in counter-guerrilla operations in the surrounding area. Those who have refused have been tortured, "disappeared" and killed and many others have been forced to flee the region. Oliva Ballona, Avelino Domínguez, Octavio Sierra, together with other community leaders have been threatened with death by members of the Colombian army.

The Presidential Adviser on Human Rights informed Amnesty International that the death threats against Oliva Ballona, Avelino Domínguez, Octavio Sierra are the subject of an investigation and that measures are being taken to protect their lives.

In addition, administrative and penal investigations have been opened into the allegations that members of the armed forces acting with paramilitary groups were responsible for the threats and harassment against civilians, including peasant and community leaders in the Magdalena Medio region. These investigations, now in the preliminary stage, are in the hands of the Regional Procurator's office, <u>Procuraduría Departamental</u>, of Barrancabermeja, Santander department and by the Regional Attorney's office, Fiscalia Regional, of Cúcuta, Norte de Santander department.

While Amnesty International welcomes the investigations now initiated, there is concern that whilst many such investigations are opened, only exceptionally do they lead to the prosecution and conviction of those actually responsible for human rights violations in Colombia.

The Presidential Adviser on Human Rights further informed Amnesty International that representatives of national and local government authorities, including the Ministry of the Interior, <u>Ministerio de Gobierno</u>, and the offices of the Procurator Delegate for the Armed and Security Forces, Procuraduría Delegada para las Fuerzas Militares,

the People's Advocate, <u>Defensoría del Pueblo</u>, and the Presidential Adviser on Human Rights had held meetings to discuss the situation of violence in the region. These meetings have reportedly resulted in the recommendation that concrete measures be taken to neutralize the criminal activities of the paramilitary forces.

- welcoming the information that investigations have been initiated into the allegations that members of the armed forces acting with paramilitary groups were responsible for the threats and harassment against civilians;
- urging that these investigations do result in the prosecution and conviction of those found responsible so that they cannot continue to act with virtual impunity;
- welcoming the meetings held by national and local authorities to discuss the situation of violence in the Magdalena Medio region and urging clarification of the measures to be taken to halt the criminal activities of paramilitary forces active in the region and to protect the lives of all non-combatant civilians.
