Italo Rodriguez's life is believed to be in danger following the discovery of the bodies of his brother Alvaro Rodríguez Carvajal and friends Alvaro Arévalo and Tomás Díáz Hurtado, whose detention by police intelligence agents was witnessed on 15 September 1994 in the town of Barranquilla, Atlántico department.

Witnesses reported the detention of five men, including the above, at a pawn shop in Murillo Street, Barranquilla by the police intelligence agents (usually known as F-2). Two of the men, whose names are not known, later escaped, but the other three were taken to an unknown destination. The F-2 denied all knowledge of the detentions, although one of the F-2 agents allegedly threatened one of the men who escaped. In addition, witnesses state that the vehicles used in the operation were later seen inside the F-2 base.

Italo Rodríguez denounced his brother's "disappearance" to the authorities. On 27 September the bodies of all three men, Alvaro Rodríguez Carvajal, Alvaro Arévalo and Tomás Díáz Hurtado were found, buried in a cemetery in nearby Cartagena as "N.N." - bodies with "No Name". The bodies were completely burnt. Italo Rodríguez was only able to recognize his brother from a ring he was wearing when he was detained.

Since the discovery of the bodies, F-2 agents have reportedly been searching for Italo Rodríguez in the homes of his relatives and friends and issuing death threats against him. He is in hiding and there is serious concern for his safety.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

- urging that the death threats against Italo Rodríguez be immediately investigated and those found responsible brought to justice;
- urging that all possible measures immediately be taken to protect the life of Italo Rodríguez.
- considering the witnessed detention by F-2 agents of Alvaro Rodríguez Carvajal, Alvaro Arévalo and Tomás Díáz Hurtado on 15 September 1994, expressing grave concern that their badly-burned bodies were found on 27 September in Cartagena;

- urging that there be an immediate and thorough investigation into the detentions and subsequent deaths of the men, the results of which should be made public and those found responsible brought to justice;
