COLOMBIAWilson BORJA DÍAZ, trade union leader

Wilson Borja Díaz, leader of the Federación Nacional de Trabajadores al Servicio del Estado (FENALTRASE), National Federation of State Service Industry Workers, was shot and wounded by gunmen on 15 December. The attack raises serious concerns for his safety and that of other trade union leaders in Colombia.

The gunmen apparently opened fire as Wilson Borja left his home in Bogotá at 6am. Wilson Borja and his two bodyguards were injured, and a street vendor was killed during the attack.

Wilson Borja is also a leading member of the *Confederación Unitaria de Trabajadores* (CUT), Trade Union Congress.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

For many years the security and armed forces and their paramilitary allies have accused trade unionists, human rights workers, members of legal opposition groups and popular activists of being guerrilla sympathizers or auxiliaries. The people they have accused have frequently been harassed, tortured and killed, often by paramilitaries. The International Confederation of Free Trade Unions Annual Survey for 1999 recorded that during the previous year more than 90 trade unionists had been murdered in Colombia.

Amnesty International has documented systematic persecution of trade unionists in Colombia. Seven trade union leaders were shot dead during the 1998 national strike, including CUT vice-president Jorge Ortega Garcia (see UA 274/98, AMR 23/80/98, 21 October 1998, and follow up, AMR 23/90/98, 24 November 1998). None of these crimes has been resolved and those responsible have not been brought to justice.

Guerrilla forces and armed opposition groups have also committed serious violations of international humanitarian law, for example executing those they accuse of being security force or paramilitary collaborators and supporters.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- urging full and impartial investigations into the attack on Wilson Borja, in which he and his two bodyguards were shot and wounded and a street vendor was killed, with the results published and all those responsible brought to justice;
- urging the authorities to do everything deemed appropriate by Wilson Borja and other trade union leaders under threat to guarantee their safety.
