#### CUBA Félix OVIEDO AGUILERA

According to the 4 August 1994 edition of the official Cuban newspaper *Granma*, Félix Oviedo Aguilera has been executed after his appeal was rejected by the Supreme Court and the Council of State decided not to commute his sentence. The report did not say when the execution took place. Four death sentences were passed in late 1993, but, as far as Amnesty International is aware, this is the first execution to have been carried out in Cuba since early 1992. Four death sentences were passed in late 1993.

Félix Oviedo Aguilera had been convicted of murder and armed robbery for an attack on a Havana bus on 2 August 1993 in which a youth was killed when he was thrown from the vehicle through a window. In November 1993, he was sentenced to death while some 22 other people were sentenced to between six months' and thirty years' imprisonment, either for being directly involved in the attack, failing to denounce it or receiving stolen goods. In its report of the execution, *Granma* noted that the characteristics of the incident had called for exemplary sentencing.

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and of the right not to be subjected to cruel inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Concern about the use of the death penalty in Cuba is heightened by the lack, or inadequacy in practice, of full judicial guarantees, particularly the right to adequate defence and especially if there is a political element to the case. Execution is by firing squad.

- deeply regretting the news that Félix Oviedo Aguilera has been executed; stating Amnesty International's unconditional opposition to the death penalty in all cases on the grounds that it violates the right to life as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and is the ultimate cruel, inhuman and degrading punishment;
- calling for all other pending death sentences to be commuted.
