Otto René Rodríguez Llerena was sentenced to death on 30 March 1999, following a trial on 15-16 March.

He had been detained in July 1998 and charged with terrorism, after trying to bring explosives into the country. He pleaded guilty, admitting both that act and planting a bomb in a Cuban hotel in August 1997.

There is no further news about Raúl Ernesto Cruz León or Francisco Portuondo Medina, who were sentenced to death on 23 March and 3 March 1999 respectively.

Amnesty International fears that all three men are at risk of imminent execution, as death sentences in Cuba are sometimes carried out within weeks of trial judgment. Condemned prisoners appeal automatically against their death sentences at the People's Supreme Court. If that court upholds the sentences, they must then be ratified by Cuba's ruling Council of State. Execution is by firing squad.

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and of the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Concern about the death penalty in Cuba is exacerbated by the authorities' failure to uphold their own guarantees of fair trial, particularly the right to defence.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- expressing concern that Otto René Rodríguez Llerena, Raúl Ernesto Cruz León and Francisco Portuondo Medina have been sentenced to death and urging that their sentences be commuted;
- expressing unconditional opposition to the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading punishment;
- expressing sympathy for the victims of violent crime and their families and friends, but pointing out that the death penalty has never been shown to deter crime more effectively than other punishments;
- urging that all other pending death sentences be commuted and that no further death sentences be passed.
