Amnesty International has learned that Humberto Real Suárez has been sentenced to death. It is believed that the other men listed above were sentenced to 30 years' imprisonment. The trial reportedly took place on 25 April 1996 in a court in the town of Santa Clara, Villa Clara province, but the sentence was not formally announced until 6 May.

Following trial, death penalty cases are automatically subject to appeal before the People's Supreme Court. If confirmed, death sentences are then brought before the Council of State, which is presided over by President Fidel Castro, and which makes the final decision on whether execution, which is by firing squad, should go ahead. The time lapse between the trial hearing and the final decision has on some occasions in the past been only a matter of days. Execution usually then goes ahead within hours or days.

The seven men were arrested on 16 October 1994 near Caibarién, 350 kilometres east of Havana, and were charged with infiltrating the country and the murder of Arcelio Rodríguez García, described by the Cuban authorities as a fisherman. The seven men are alleged to be members of a Cuban exile group called the *Partido de Unidad Nacional Democrático (PUND)*, National Democratic Unity Party, which is based in Miami, USA.

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and of the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Concern about the death penalty in Cuba is exacerbated by the inadequacy, in practice, of full judicial guarantees, particularly the right to defence and especially if there is a political element to the case.

- urging commutation of the death sentence passed on Humberto Real Suárez;
- stating unconditional opposition to the death penalty in all cases;
- expressing concern and sympathy for the families and friends of the victims of violent crime.
