According to reports all but six of the more than 20 dissidents arrested in the run up to the Ibero-American Summit, which took place in Havana on 15-16 November 1999, have now been released.

The released include: Héctor Palacios Ruiz, Ramón Humberto Colás Castillo and the mothers of three political prisoners detained after they took part in a peaceful demonstration calling for the release of political prisoners.

Two of those still in detention are Dr. Oscar Elías Biscet González, president of the Fundación Lawton de Derechos Humanos, Lawton Foundation for Human Rights, and Antonio Alonso Pérez, President of the Alianza Nacional de Agricultores Independientes, Association of Independent Farmers, who was detained on 7 November as he set out to participate in a congress of independent farmers.

Oscar Biscet has reportedly been charged with "desórdenes públicos", "public disorder", which carries a maximum sentence of one year's imprisonment if no weapons or explosives are used. He is reportedly now being held at a detention centre in Havana but relatives have been told that he will be moved to a prison to await trial, although no date has been set for the trial yet.

Antonio Alonso Pérez has reportedly been charged with "sacrificio de ganado", "sacrifice of cattle" and, on 15 November, was reportedly transferred to the Manguito Prison in Santiago de Cuba province to await trial. Amnesty International believes that he may have been detained in connection with his work with independent farmers, and is seeking further information.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- urging that all those still detained in connection with the recent Ibero-American summit be released unless charged with a recognizably criminal offence;
- asking for the immediate and unconditional release of Dr. Oscar Elías Biscet González, on the grounds that he is a prisoner of conscience detained solely for peacefully attempting to exercise his right to freedom of expression, association and assembly;
- asking for details about the charges made against Antonio Alonso Pérez;
- urging that all those detained be granted immediate access to lawyers of their choosing.
